To the A2 Transportation Commission,

On Monday, May 5 at 2 PM I witnessed a senior woman get hit by a truck as she crossed Stone School Road via Birch Hollow Drive. The woman was in the crosswalk going East and the truck (a contractor van) was driving South on Stone School towards the bridge over the 94. The truck stopped and bystanders helped the woman, who remained conscious, but dazed. An ambulance was called.

I have walked across this intersection many times because my kids go to a nearby daycare, and we walk to Mary Beth Doyle park. Stone School Road does not have any stop signs at this intersection in the North/South direction; only East/West at Birch Hollow. Which is odd, because the North/South lanes get a ton of traffic into and out of the city due to the proximity of the 94 freeway. I have seen people roll through or blow past even the stop signs in their haste, and consider it an unsafe intersection to cross.

After doing some research this week I understand that traffic improvements in the form of RRFBs are slated to be installed here. Please do so with utmost haste, and please continue to monitor the intersection for additional improvements.
