1. Ken Garber - Sustainability Commission bylaws (CA-9) (in person)

Ken Garber, resident, expressed concern about the approval of the new Sustainability Commission bylaws in CA-9. He noted the lack of opportunity for public comment under the new bylaws, compared to the previous Energy and Environmental Commissions.

2. Kathy Griswold - North Main Street Transportation Study (CA-3) & Backlog of pedestrian safety improvements (in person)

Kathy Griswold, resident, spoke in opposition to CA-3, urging Council to stop hiring consultants.

3. Tom Stulberg - Bond issuance for the Arbor South Project (DC-1) (phone)

Tom Stulberg, resident, spoke about DC-1 and expressed concern regarding the issuance of City bonds for the support of the Arbor South project.

## 4. Kitty Kahn - Bond issuance for the Arbor South Project (DC-1) (phone)

Kitty Kahn, resident, spoke in opposition to DC-1, calling it "Pay for Play."

### 5. Hannah Stanton-Gockel - Safety on Stadium Blvd (in person)

Hannah Stanton-Gockel, resident, spoke about bike safety on Stadium Boulevard. She spoke about her program, "Bubbles for Bike Lanes."

### 6. Alex Lowe - Comprehensive Plan (in person)

Alex Lowe, resident, provided comments regarding the proposed Comprehensive Land Use Plan.

### 7. Shannon Lau - Comprehensive Plan (in person)

Shannon Lau, Pittsfield Township resident, spoke about the proposed Comprehensive Land Use Plan, stating Ann Arbor has become unaffordable.

## 8. Patricia Austin - Announcing a new historical plaque (in person)

Patricia Austin, resident, announced a new plaque honoring Ann Arbor's history and the most recent bicentennial celebration. She stated the plaque also clarifies some of the facts regarding the naming of Ann Arbor.

# 9. Peter Eckstein - Arbor South Parking Decks (in person)

Peter Eckstein, resident, spoke about the financial commitment regarding the issuance of bonds for the proposed parking decks in DC-1.

# 11. Jeremy Haley - Property taxes (in person)

Jeremy Haley, Ypsilanti resident, spoke about property taxes and the uncapping of taxes that occurs after ownership changes.

# 10. Mark Hanss - City maintenance (phone)

Mark Hanss, resident, and former employee, expressed concern about the form answers provided by City staff in response to his A2FixIt requests. He specifically asked for attention regarding tree trimming requests near Green Road.
