Dear Mayor Taylor & members of the Ann Arbor Transportation Commission,

I am writing with reference to the proposal to narrow the Wallingford / Harding Intersection. I read with interest / surprise that this is for traffic calming reasons.

I would like to object to this proposal for the following reasons:

1. I walk/bike my children to/from school past this intersection regularly. I have never noticed much in the way of traffic even at the traditionally busy school run times. The same cannot be said for other roads in/out of this Tappan school neighborhood.

I purposefully taught my children to bike via Wallingford due to it being the quietest and safest route for them to/fro school. There is no objective evidence to support the need for traffic calming. This seems like very poor use of what I can only assume are valuable & scarce funds.

- 2. In contrast the state of repair in neighboring roads has rendered some of the roads very high risk. I have seen children fall off bikes in huge pot holes and have witnessed cars speeding up and down neighboring roads. I cannot understand why repairs & safety in this very neighborhood are not being prioritized more effectively from high to low risk.
- 3. There are multiple areas where traffic is a huge risk and that I know have been reported on multiple times following traffic accidents. Hill & Washtenaw junctions being prime examples. I fail to understand why a very low risk area is being prioritized over high risk areas.
- 4. I am from the UK. Curves in roads are attractive and bring character to a neighborhood. The proposed traffic calming plan to remove the curve is not only unnecessary, but the design is not in fitting with the rest of the neighborhood. I cannot understand why money would be wasted to correct something that is attractive and not a traffic related risk?

We depend on you to be good stewards of our City and to sensibly allocate taxpayer funds or grants. This seems to be a total waste of time and money.

I urge you to reconsider moving forward with this project and instead prioritize something more high risk that would bring value to this community and enhance safety.
