Hi Jasmine,

Thank you for reaching out.



First, I am so incredibly sorry for the delay in my response. After receiving your initial message, I immediately reached out to our legal staff to better understand the current state of drug enforcement in Ann Arbor. Unfortunately, I've had an incredibly busy couple of weeks since then, and I'm just catching up!

After speaking with our Assistant City Attorney who handles ordinance enforcement, I understand that we do not charge any possession of drug cases under city ordinance. Those cases are generally enforced by the County Prosecutor, Eli Savit, or the state of Michigan. My understanding is that the only cases that the city handles regarding "possession" are the open intoxication cases (that are heavily weighted toward excessively drunk people during football games – generally as a public health/welfare tool) and drunk/drugged driving cases, which obviously have significant public safety implications beyond the individual using.

All this said, I would be happy to make myself available to chat with you about your goals, share thoughts/feedback, and discuss a potential path forward. I would love to include our Asst. City Attorney in this conversation, if you'd be amenable to that, because she would be able to add considerable day-to-day enforcement & local justice system context to the conversation.

While I wholeheartedly agree that we must be better about treating substance use as a public health issue instead of a criminalization issue, candidly, I also have some concerns about aspects of the resolution that I think may be overly broad and/or don't fully account for the nuances that exist between individuals and their unique situations.

For example, my sister is a social worker currently focused on clients with substance use disorders – primarily new/expectant mothers. In conversations I've had with her and her colleagues, many of their clients would not be in treatment or seeking assistance for their children without intervention from our highly successful local drug treatment courts (which are, in many ways, already shifting the conversation around substance use from criminalization to public health, by enforcing treatment, rather than jail time.

Again, I would be happy to engage in this conversation to learn more about your perspectives and goals, and to see where we might have common ground to move forward specific policy objectives locally. In the meantime, if you haven't already, I would also encourage you to reach out to Prosecutor Savit and/or members of the County board as well.

If you're available, while it is short notice, I have the next few days off of work from my day-job and am starting to fill them with City-related meetings. If our City Attorney is available as well, would you have any availability to meet on Tuesday or early Wednesday?

This letter is a compilation of all the concerns raised by people from that meeting you organized at York. Because not all of the concerns fit the city's current traffic calming process (one street at a time), we wanted to write up all the concerns into a single organized document, to help city staff get a more holistic view of the problems in our neighborhood. My understanding is that people are also organizing around a traditional traffic calming petition for Page, but I'm not involved in that part.

I know that there are a few decisions coming up, like the TBD quick build projects that were funded in the budget, where I wanted to get our neighborhood on the radar as a possible candidate for trying something new, given that the neighborhood traffic calming queue is approaching 4 years long. Historically, the neighborhoods that make noise tend to get help sooner, so we decided to try making some noise. Happy to discuss further if that would be helpful.

Dear City Coouncil Members,

We are a group of Ward 4 residents who live in the neighborhood sandwiched between Packard and S. Industrial, with Harpst St to the north and Marlborough Drive to the south. For years we have lived with large gaps in pedestrian infrastructure, deteriorating pavement, and aggressive cut through traffic. Past attempts to address these concerns, such as speed bumps on individual streets, and neighborhood slow streets during the pandemic, have been minor fixes at best, and sometimes they've created new problems.
