University of Michigan Credit Union Site Plan and a Special Exception Use for City Planning Commission Approval - A proposal to build a new 4,740 square foot building with three drive-through lanes and 22 parking spaces on this 1-acre site located at 2929 Plymouth Road. Parcel is zoned O (Office). A Special Exception Use is requested for the three drive-through teller lanes.
