Speaker 1: Jeff Crockett

• Concerned about pedestrian safety and lack of data on transportation violations.

• Suggested public surveys, increased enforcement, and cooperation with the University of Michigan for bike and scooter safety.

Speaker 2: Kathy Griswold

• Stressed Vision Zero must be data-driven with crash analysis and faster action on safety improvements.

• Raised concerns about building regulations affecting line of sight and the need for better crosswalks near schools.

Speaker 3: Adam Jaskiewich

• Highlighted drivers failing to yield and endangering pedestrians.

• Criticized Vision Zero's focus on education, advocating for stronger engineering solutions.

Speaker 4: Adam Goodman

• Frustrated with Ann Arbor's outdated bike lane designs.

• Suggested adding buffers between parked cars and bike lanes on roads like Pauline.

Speaker 5: Alex Lowe

• Questioned reliance on education for safety improvements, pushing for road design changes to slow drivers.

• Raised concerns about ineffective enforcement of cars parked in bike lanes.
