1. Diana Kimball - Ann Arbor Women's Group (CA-9) (in person)

Diana Kimball, resident and member of the Ann Arbor Women's Group, spoke in support of CA-9 regarding recognizing the Group as a civic nonprofit organization operating in Ann Arbor for the purpose of obtaining a charitable gaming license.

2. Adam Goodman - Dexter Rd. Rezoning (C-1) (phone)

Adam Goodman, resident of the 5th ward, expressed concern on C-1, the rezoning of the park on Dexter Road, stating Ann Arbor has too many parks and should prioritize maintaining the existing parks, instead of acquiring more.
