PROJECT PROPOSAL

In 1964, Elizabeth R. Dean bequeathed \$2 million to the City of Ann Arbor for the income to be used *"to be held in trust in perpetuity, to repair, maintain and replace trees on city property."* The trust is managed by the Elizabeth Dean Fund Committee which accepts, reviews, and considers proposals for special tree planting and maintenance projects to enhance Ann Arbor's urban and community forest as one of the allocations of the income.

1. Describe the project. Please include the nearest cross streets or other means to identify the specific location.

Addition of 1 to 3 new trees at Creal Park to provide much-needed shade, cooling, natural beauty, and ecological diversity at this well-loved neighborhood park. The neighborhood surrounding the park underwent a large utility replacement project last summer that included refurbishing sidewalks, streets, and the park entrance off Argyle Crescent. The Creal Park neighbors, in partnership with the city's Adopt-a-Park program, propose the following additional trees in order of preference:

- 1. A Tulip Poplar between the basketball court and the playground shade courts and privacy b/w teens at courts and little ones at playground
- 2. An American Sycamore south of the swingset shade to swings and playground
- 3. A oak in the extension off Argyle Crescent by the trash can shade for playcourts, privacy from road Page 1 of 2

2. How does the project meet one or more of the Outcomes listed in the application form?

Addition of one to three additional native trees at this park will enhance the neighborhood by providing additional shade and it's cooling effects and help with noise reduction to neighbors from park activites and provide a more natural experience at this largely open park. It will add beautification to areas without an existing connecting tree canopy and provide more habitat for local wildlife. Having native trees and exposing neighbors and families to their benefits will enhance environmental stewardship among park visitors. Biodiversity will be improved by adding trees that support local insects that feed birds and produce food and shelter for small critters like squirrels.
