Subject: City contractor snow removal issues

See the attached link and photo. There are a few spots of sidewalks and curb cuts that I've been noticing rarely get cleared promptly if at all, and most are the city's responsibility sadly. I saw this intersection - a crosswalk on the city right of way, north of the roundabout on Nixon and Huron Parkway, reported on Seeclickfix as of Feb 14. On Feb 24th the city indicated that the contractor was notified and promptly addressed it.

Well, I went over there this morning and even after a rain and warm temps the intersection is impassable by Walker or Wheelchair, mounded with ice and snow.

I think we need to look at the effectiveness of this contractor closely - if we are paying them based on performance we should hold them up to the same standards as we hold our citizens and neighbors. This ticket was closed when it had not been fully addressed and it makes me wonder about other intersections.

As you know, in recent memory we had an elderly man slip and fall and die due to his injuries, exactly because of an improperly cleared curb cut. I would hate to see that happen again, especially if it's the city's responsibility to clear it.
