Proposal for EDA's Build to Scale (B2S) Program

Lead Organization: Ann Arbor SPARK

Program Focus: Expanding the SmartZone entrepreneurial ecosystem to underserved communities in Washtenaw County, informed by the region's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS).

Summary:

Ann Arbor SPARK seeks funding through the Economic Development Administration's (EDA) Build to Scale (B2S) program to expand our SmartZone entrepreneurial ecosystem into underserved areas, such as rural regions of Washtenaw County and Ypsilanti. This initiative will offer a "concierge" service with dedicated program staff, provide grant writing support, and enhance access to resources for startups. Aligned with Southeast Michigan's CEDS, the program will drive technology-based entrepreneurship and create jobs in underserved areas.

Project Objectives:

Expand Entrepreneurial Ecosystem:

Focus on creating a vibrant startup environment in Ypsilanti and rural Washtenaw County.

• Grant Writing Support:

Hire a grant writer to assist startups in applying for funding and programs.

Technology Verticals:

Expand efforts in mobility, cybersecurity, life sciences, and emerging areas like AI, clean energy, and advanced manufacturing.

• Strengthen Entrepreneurship Pipeline:

Provide "concierge" services to connect entrepreneurs with venture capital, workforce training, and technology resources.

Capacity Building & Scaling:

Scale SPARK's business acceleration programs into underserved areas, aligned with CEDS priorities.

Program Interventions:

SPARK Acceleration Program:

Expand to underserved areas, providing access to mentors and business resources.

• Business Acceleration Grants:

Targeted grants for growth milestones like legal support and marketing.

Mentor Network & Skills Training:

Extend the mentor network and offer training on market segmentation and capital access.

Skills Training:

Provide targeted skills development through SPARK's Entrepreneur Boot Camp.

• Community Engagement:

Organize showcases and create co-working spaces to promote a culture of innovation.

Concierge Service Role:

Dedicated staff will guide businesses through SPARK's programs and external offerings, with support from a new grant writer to help secure funding.

We will secure matching funds from Washtenaw County and the Ann Arbor-Ypsilanti SmartZone to ensure the program's sustainability and regional support.
