• School Traffic Calming: City exploring ways to improve safety and reduce congestion near schools.

• Busing Policy: Commissioners urged a more strategic approach beyond minor radius adjustments to encourage bus use.

• Parental Engagement: Schools should collaborate with parents to address barriers to busing.

• Drop-Off Infrastructure: Concerns raised about expanding pickup lanes, which may increase car dependency.

• Safe Routes to School (SRTS): Need for standardized walking route maps across all schools.

• Equity in Safety Improvements: Schools should receive equal attention regardless of parental advocacy.

• *City-Led Mapping: Staff developing proactive school travel maps to identify safety priorities.*

• Long-Term Planning: Discussion on how zoning changes could support more walkable school communities.

• 5th Avenue Bike Lanes: The contraflow lane is not currently designed as protected, with pavement markings and possible posts but no concrete separation. Protection is being considered within the Downtown Circulation Study framework.

• MDOT Jurisdictional Transfer Letter: The date the letter was sent will be added for reference.

• Streetlight LED Conversion: Progress is unclear, but parts may have been ordered. An update will be provided next month.

VII.B.) Liaison Reports (Bret Hautamaki) (5 Minutes)

City Planning Commission Updates on Capital Improvements Plan (CIP) and Land Use Planning:

• Sunset Sidewalk Connectivity: The project near Newport and Sunset has been postponed and bundled into a larger comprehensive transportation plan for the area. Some commissioners are advocating to separate it from the CIP.

• East Maiden Lane Bridge Widening: Concerns were raised about the exclusion of a pedestrian underpass in the project, as many view the site as a dangerous intersection.

• CIP Project Scope: The plan includes 510 projects, prioritized using a structured evaluation process.

• Land Use and Density Planning: The Planning Commission is considering zoning changes to allow for increased density, particularly near schools, while balancing concerns about introducing multi-story buildings in traditionally single-family neighborhoods.
