• Request for list of corridors under review and access to higher-resolution maps.

• Questions about engagement strategies and how they differ from past efforts.

• Inquiry about alignment with other initiatives like Safe Streets for All and quick build projects.

• Concerns about traffic diversion impacts and how they'll be evaluated.

• Interest in how study outcomes might inform future pursuit of jurisdictional transfers.

• Request for examples of corridors likely to need further data collection or pose implementation challenges.

Commissioner questions and comments:

• Clarification on why Miller Road received a two-way cycle track design; staff confirmed it is classified as a major corridor with higher design standards.

• Appreciation expressed for the long-term planning and progress toward a connected protected network.

• Concern raised that treatments on minor streets (e.g., sharrows, painted lanes) may not adequately serve children or individuals with cognitive or physical disabilities.

• Questions about how sidewalk infrastructure is integrated into the AAA framework, especially as fallback for those who do not feel safe in the roadway.

• Interest in how design decisions reflect speed data, user behavior, and service needs (e.g., solid waste, fire access).

• Clarification requested on why protected bike lanes were not placed together on one side of Fifth Avenue; staff cited design complexity, comfort tradeoffs, and access needs.
