## Office of Sustainability and Innovation

- City awarded grant to advance SEU: The Sustainable Energy Utility (SEU) has won
  a competitive grant for \$250,000 to support foundational activities, including building
  a public-private partnership plan, educating and connecting with potential vendors
  and contractors, beginning rate design, and more. The grant also opens the door for
  a potential, larger second round of funding from the grantor, the Municipal
  Investment Fund. Read more about this award!

- Ann Arbor Launches Air Quality Map and Alert System: The City of Ann Arbor Office
  of Sustainability and Innovations (OSI) is announcing a partnership with Clarity
  Movement (Clarity), the manufacturers of its city-wide network of 10 air quality
  monitors, to launch a new map displaying the current air quality index (AQI) at each
  of 10 monitoring locations. The new map can be found at <a href="www.a2gov.org/airquality">www.a2gov.org/airquality</a>
  and features a way to sign up for email alerts when AQI reaches an "unhealthy"
  level.
- Business Rebates for Electric Leaf Blowers: <u>Business rebates for electric leaf blowers have been reinstated</u> through September 30, 2026, or until funding is expended. Designed to help lower the cost of transitioning from gas to electric leaf blowers in accordance with Ann Arbor's leaf blower ordinance, these rebates will be available to businesses that provide lawn care or landscaping services to properties located in Ann Arbor.
- OSI Makes National News: OSI has captured national attention from <u>NPR for its</u>
   work in on the <u>Sustainable Energy Utility (SEU)</u> and international attention from the
   <u>BBC for its work in the Bryant Community</u>. This recognition underscores Ann Arbor's
   leadership in climate action and highlights the power of community-driven solutions
   to address one of the most pressing challenges of our time.
