## NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

A public hearing on the following items will be held by the Ann Arbor City Planning Commission on Tuesday, March 4, 2025 at 7:00 p.m.

<u>1209 S University Avenue:</u> Proposed site plan to construct a new 19 story mixed use residential building with ground floor retail on a 0.39 acre site zoned D1. The proposed development includes demolition of the existing retail buildings and reconstruction of the pedestrian corridor along Church Street and South University Avenue. The site is located in Ward 1.

<u>343 South Fifth</u>: Proposed rezoning from PL to D1 zoning to pursue a future public-private development. No development is proposed currently. The 1.21-acre site includes the library building and the adjacent surface parking lot. This site is located in Ward 5.

<u>2325 Crystal Way</u>: Proposed rezoning from R4A to PL zoning. The lot was recently acquired by the City for an expansion of the Hickory Nature Area. This site is located in Ward 1.
