



I live on Hill St. where cars race to Washtenaw as though their lives depended on it. I've even been passed as someone beeped and crossed the yellow line in a race to Washtenaw. Arrived a few seconds before me only to wait at the red light. On Division the city has installed barricades as well as painted crosswalks in the area leading up to and passing Community High School. I don't expect you to do that but at least you definitely need to slow the traffic on Hill before there's a tragic accident. You've repainted the crosswalk on Hill where the children cross to go to school but not the one near Ruthven Place.

Why can't you paint crosswalks on Hill St. where it intersects with Onondaga and Dorset? The cost is low and the results are more safety for all. There are a lot of older people and younger ones walking their children and dogs across Hill at that location. I'm one of the older. Every time I cross there I take my life in my hands. I'm sure most of my neighbors agree with that. At the corners of Berkshire and Vinewood which is flat and gets probably a tenth as much traffic as Hill St. they have STOP signs at both corners although drivers are more cautious than when they drive down Hill. I would love to see STOP signs on Hill as well but you probably don't agree with me. I would be happy even if you only take the far cheaper choice.
