Hello,

My name is Jay W. Belle Isle and I have been a resident at Surrey Park Apartments (2532 Keystone Lane) for 27 years. We are the tiny complex next door to the above-referenced property. I'm writing to comment on Araneae, Inc.'s request for a variance to allow for **13 illuminated logo signs approximately 35 feet above the ground.**
