Dear Members of the Ann Arbor City Council,

Home of New Vision (HNV) requests approval from our local governing body to apply for initial qualification from the state for a non-profit charitable gambling license for Home of New Vision (HNV). As stated in the Local Civic Organization Requirements from the Michigan Lottery, "#6 A copy of a resolution passed by the local governing body of government, stating organization is a recognized nonprofit organization in the community (form attached)."

For over 25 years, HNV has been providing hope and recovery to individuals and families affected by substance use disorder. As a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization, we offer person-centered care and a full spectrum of support services that help people navigate their unique pathways to recovery.

Our organization is committed to breaking down the barriers that often stand in the way of recovery. We focus on addressing the whole person by providing not only treatment but also essential resources such as stable housing, employment assistance, and social support. With the right support, recovery is possible, and treatment works.

**Program Overview**

**Outpatient Treatment Services**

We offer comprehensive outpatient services, including individual, group, and family therapy for children, adolescents, and adults. Our licensed clinicians use a variety of therapeutic

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approaches tailored to meet the needs of those we serve, including trauma-informed care, cognitive behavioral therapy, and motivational interviewing.

### **Residential Treatment Services**

Located in Ann Arbor, our residential program provides 24/7 support in a structured environment designed to help individuals achieve and sustain long-term recovery. The program includes therapeutic activities and community engagement to foster personal growth and resilience.

### **Engagement Centers**

With locations in Ypsilanti and Jackson, our Engagement Centers offer a safe and supportive alternative to emergency room care for individuals experiencing a substance use crisis. These short-term facilities provide a clean, welcoming environment where clients can stabilize, access basic needs, and connect with treatment and recovery resources in the community.

### **ROOT (Recovery Opioid Overdose Team)**

Our ROOT program responds to opioid overdoses and provides critical support to survivors within 3-5 hours of an emergency call to the Emergency Room, as well as following up on reported overdoses within 24-72 hours. The team offers recovery coaching, harm reduction services, and resources to help individuals on their path to recovery.

### **Recovery Housing**

We provide safe, structured recovery housing for both men and women. Our programs offer peer-to-peer support, medication-assisted treatment options, and resources to help individuals develop the skills needed to transition to independent living in the community.

### **Washtenaw Recovery Advocacy Project (WRAP)**

Founded in 2015, WRAP advocates for individuals affected by substance use disorders through community education and policy engagement. WRAP works to reduce stigma and promote multiple pathways to recovery by offering recovery support, outreach, and events like Recovery Walk and Sober Bowl.

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### **Ypsilanti Recovery Wellness Center**

Opened in 2023, this drop-in center serves as a hub for recovery support, offering peer coaching and connections to services across the community. The center focuses on the Eight Dimensions of Wellness to support individuals in achieving a balanced and healthy lifestyle.

### **Community Impact**

HNV's approach is rooted in collaboration with the community to build a supportive environment that fosters recovery. By promoting change and awareness, we work to end the stigma associated with substance use disorders and create a community where recovery is celebrated and supported.

We are seeking this charitable gambling license to raise funds to continue and expand these vital programs, enhancing our capacity to serve the people of Ann Arbor and Washtenaw County. Your support will help us make a lasting impact on individuals and families affected by addiction and mental health disorders.

Dear Applicant:

This modifies our letter of the above date in which we stated that you would be treated as an organization that is not a private foundation until the expiration of your advance ruling period.

Your exempt status under section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) is still in effect. Based on the information you submitted, we have determined that you are not a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because you are an organization of the type described in section 509(a)(1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi).

Grantors and contributors may rely on this determination unless the Internal Revenue Service publishes notice to the contrary. However, if you lose your section 509(a)(1) status, a grantor or contributor may not rely on this determination if he or she was in part responsible for, or was aware of, the act or failure to act, or the substantial or material change on the part of the organization that resulted in your loss of such status, or if he or she acquired knowledge that the Internal Revenue Service had given notice that you would no longer be classified as a section 509(a)(1) organization.

You are required to make your annual information return, Form 990 or Form 990-EZ, available for public inspection for three years after the later of the due date of the return or the date the return is filed. You are also required to make available for public inspection your exemption application, any supporting documents, and your exemption letter. Copies of these documents are also required to be provided to any individual upon written or in person request without charge other than reasonable fees for copying and postage. You may fulfill this requirement by placing these documents on the Internet. Penalties may be imposed for failure to comply with these requirements. 
