V OLD BUSINESS

A. Service Line Inventory & Replacement Update

- Reviewed changes to the public facing dashboard. Changes to data presentation were to improve user experience by streamlining data.

- 66 service lines to inventory. The CDSMI due to EGLE by 10/16/24.*
- 472 lines to replace within the next 10 years.*
- 451 lines have been replaced since the program began map has 441. There are 10 services lines that have been replaced, but are awaiting GIS to update the data so it's reflected on the map.*
- Public Works will be sending notification to locations that are eligible for replacement within 30 days of the CDSMI due date.*

B. EGLE LCR Action Level

- Action Level for lead dropping from 15 parts per billion (ppb) to 12 ppb on January 1, 2025.
- Those water supplies over 12, but under 15 will be considered out of compliance.
- City of Ann Arbor's lead sampling is done every 3 years. The last round was 2023 and was well below 12 ppb at 2 ppb. All lead samples are sent out and processed by a 3rd party.
- Ann Arbor supplies water to surrounding townships, and the townships are responsible for their own lead monitoring.
- Note that if the Federal rule changes pass this month the Action Level will drop to 10 ppb, effective date TBD.

C. EGLE & SDWAC Updates

- The Filter First drinking water management plans are due by 1/24/25. These plans are not managed by Ann Arbor Water, they are the responsibility of the schools and childcare centers. These locations are required to test yearly and test below 5ppb.
