Hello

I understand the need for more affordable housing in Ann Arbor but I am against re-zoning to allow for buildings up to 48 feet and more than 4 families in neighborhoods outside of downtown, like Maplewood-Orchard Hills of Plymouth Rd.

A lot of my reluctance has to do with ensuring the conservation of green spaces/urban oases. AAPS grossly failed our community with respect to Thurston/Logan/Clague and many of us really don't want a repeat. In fact, I've attached a picture to show the 4 active and simultaneous construction sites (circled in red) that our neighborhood and children is being forced to endure for years - staggering of these projects would have been very much welcomed here (Logan/Clague, Thurston, UM Credit Union, Nixon Rd Improvements). We are to the point where we joke/not joke for people to toss us food over the construction fences - we are that fatigued already.

In any case, preservation of green spaces and parks is very much important and valued by Ann Arbor residents. In Denver, developers/contractors were required to earmark 10% of their project budgets for city beautification (ie. Gardens and public art) to prevent ugly and shoddy work (fast and poorly planned). I think this requirement is an excellent idea.

We ask that the City take time to plan and engage communities, community by community, and not allow developers to call the shots.
