NAP:

Supported the City's <u>Bicentennial Tree Planting Ceremony</u> in the University of Michigan's Nichols
Arboretum. The bicentennial tree was one of fifty-three trees that were planted by City and UM in an
effort to restore the Arb after significant storm damage in 2023. Mayor Taylor and President Ono
provided remarks celebrating the longstanding partnership between the City and UM to manage the
Arb, where the City owns a portion of the land but the site is maintained and operated by UM.

Greenbelt:

- Applied for a Wetlands Conservation Program grant to fund a potential natural area conservation easement
- Joined WCPARC in site visits to properties that were recently nominated to the Greenbelt
- Met with Sonoma County, CA staff to share our best-practices and innovations with Buy-Protect-Sell acquisitions.

Liveries:

• After Labor Day the liveries have transitioned to our fall hours.

- Closing September 15 for the season.

Veterans:

- Veteran's Memorial Ice Arena opened to the public on September 8th

GIVE/AAP:

- GIVE has been working with a small but mighty staff this summer. We are still going strong with event workdays scheduled throughout the fall.
- River clean up trips run June-September. We have completed 23 trips and we have 6 more to go. So far
 we have recovered 2206.4 lbs of litter from the Huron River. This is the most litter recovered in a season
 by over 100 lbs and we are still going!
- Staff is preparing for the annual Trick or Treat Paddle event that is taking place October 13th this year. We have 43 volunteers signed up out of 80, which is great for early September. Marketing efforts are underway for promotion of the event and volunteer recruitment.

Huron Hills:
