Hello,

My name is Brittany Toth and I live off Ann Arbor Saline in the Bella Vista neighborhood (near AA Saline Rd and Maple).

I work/exercise in the Woodland Plaza so I travel this section of Ann Arbor Saline Rd. between Maple and S, Main St 1-2 times daily. Many mornings my work commute is around 4:30 AM and if not, my exercise commute is between 4:45-7:00 AM. During these times, the traffic lights specifically at **Ann Arbor Saline Rd** and Eisenhower and **Ann Arbor Saline Rd and I-94 on/off ramp** are NOT currently working based upon actual traffic using sensors. Some mornings depending on the time I leave, I have sat for 1 minute + with zero traffic on all sides and red lights on all sides. Turn lane lights are still very long like they are during the daytime, yet no traffic is coming from any direction. Lights are not at all impacted on a sensor-basis by my vehicle.

I'm curious about a few things:

1. Why aren't these lights on sensors?
2. What type of process would need to be done to make this happen?
