1. Are any of the delays (MDOT and Amtrak railroad permitting, a fiber utility conflict that led to redesign work and approval from MDOT for a modified pier footing, micropile and steel sheeting conflict downtime, beam replacement) required because the bridge is being widened?
2. The memo notes that *"when the beams were removed during construction, they were found to be more deteriorated than was initially thought, thus necessitating the fabrication of new beams. This extension of purchasing authority includes all the items listed above, in addition to the cost and wait time for the new beams."* However, DLZ's 2021 [Scope of Services](#) (pg. 10) anticipates that new beams may be needed.
