#### 1. Ginny Rogers - Green Rental Housing (C-1) (in person)

Ginny Rogers, resident, spoke in favor of the Green Rental Housing Ordinance and she provided some history stating this concept was part of the original A2Zero plan.

#### 2. Larry Junck - Green Rental Housing (C-1) (in person)

Larry Junck, resident, spoke in favor of the Green Rental Housing Ordinance. He expressed concern regarding a continued reliance on fossil fuels. Junck stated he would like to see similar standards for homeowners.

#### 3. Diana Watches - Green Rental Housing (C-1) (in person)

*Diana Watches, Ypsilanti Township resident, was not present for public comment.* 

#### 4. Ken Garber - A2Zero Week Proclamation (INT-2) (in person)

Ken Garber, resident, spoke about the City's A2Zero goals not being strong enough. He urged Council to look critically at the City's 2030 carbon neutrality and carbon level goals.

#### 5. Chuck Ream - The Comprehensive Plan (in person)

Chuck Ream, resident, was not present for public comment.

#### 6. Henry Herskovitz - Holocaust education in Ann Arbor public schools (in person)

Henry Herskovitz, resident, announced the publication of the Holocaust Encyclopedia and discussed its uses for students.

#### 7. Rhea Chappell - City Council stance on federal immigration enforcement (in person)

Rhea Chappell, resident of Ward 1, encouraged the City not to collaborate with ICE, including not funding ICE, not assisting ICE, and not engaging in information sharing with ICE/DHS.

#### 8. Jake Baur - Immigration Protections (in person)

Jake Baur, resident, was not present for public comment.

#### 9. Peter Coratti - The Ann Arbor City Building Department (in person)

Peter Coratti, Milford Township resident, was not present for public comment.

#### 10. Mozhgan Savabieasfahani - We are against military aid to Israel (in person)

Mozhgan Savabieasfahani, resident, stated the City's A2Zero efforts are not actually making a difference in climate action. She also spoke about members of Council supporting Israel while they are committing atrocities against the Palestinian people.

#### 11. Blaine Coleman - We are against military aid to Israel (in person)

Blaine Coleman, resident, demanded that Council pass a resolution against military aid to Israel.

#### 12. Jeremy Haley - General comment on City revenue and expenditures (in person)
