  very large customer turnouts on Saturdays, with thousands of visitors attending each week.
- Wednesday Market is our 'Community Day', where we host local educational organizations, non-profits, and City departments to provide information about their programs and get the public involved. This season we have hosted: Ann Arbor Greenbelt, Ann Arbor Senior Center, Ann Arbor Meals on Wheels, Ann Arbor Water, Clear Computing, Ecology Center, Fresh Start Clubhouse, Growing Hope, Judson Center, Michigan Farmlink/Washtenaw County Conservation District, MSU Extension, Samaritas, Supportive Connections, Washtenaw Community College, UM Dietetics & Public Health, UM Social Minds Lab, UM Wolverine Street Medicine, Washtenaw

- Solar panel installation at Cobblestone Farm began Tuesday November 14 and is expected to finish by Thursday November 30.

## **Conservation Ops**

## NAP:

- NAP held public strategic planning sessions on November 9<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>, 16<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>. While the public feedback has not been fully synthesized into recommendations for the strategic plan at this point, there is clear and ardent support for NAP's mission and programming by the attendees. Attendees challenge NAP's current form and context, and expressed an array of thoughts on potential program improvements and expansions to consider for the future.
- NAP has welcomed two new staff in the past few months: Eleva Potter, NAP's first-ever Environmental Education & Engagement Coordinator, and Rachel Maranto, NAP's newest Stewardship Supervisor. Eleva joined NAP in late August and has hit the ground running making connections to develop an expanded portfolio of environmental education opportunities in our community, and she comes to the City with an extensive environmental education background. Rachel (re)joined the City last month, and after spending over a decade leading stewardship efforts across Michigan and beyond. We're thrilled Rachel's career boomeranged and she's landed in the City parks once more.

## **Greenbelt:**

- The Greenbelt has successfully submitted four (4) USDA NRCS ACEP-ALE grants applications totaling \$1.2M in financial assistance for City conservation easement acquisitions. The Greenbelt averages two (2) ACEP-ALE applications annually, so this is an exceptional year for the City's Greenbelt grant submissions.
- The Greenbelt Advisory Commission has recommended to City Council the selection of two
  purchasers of the City's first-ever buy-protect-sell property. The purchases will advance to City
  Council for consideration in late December. This recommendations comes after extensive staff
  review, scoring and ranking, and represent a key milestone in the buildout of the Greenbelt's
  innovative buy-protect-sell acquisition framework.
