Safety Update *Healthy Living*

Recently, there has been a cyclosporiasis outbreak in Southeast Michigan. Cyclosporiasis is an intestinal illness caused by a parasite. People can become infected by consuming food that contains the parasite. It is not usually life-threatening. Cyclosporiasis spreads when people eat food contaminated with feces. Best practices include, wash your hands with soap and clean water before you eat/prepare food, wash all fruits and vegetables thoroughly under running water before eating/preparing, cut away damaged or bruised areas on fruits and vegetables, and refrigerate items as needed.
