SAFETY NOTES

Safety Update City's Safety Unit recently recognized the employees at the Water Resources Recovery Facility (WRRF) for their strong safety culture and safety performance. A recent analysis of injury and illness trends showed that the WRRF has consistently reduced incident rates over time. In fact, there have been zero recordable injuries or illnesses since 2022. This is an incredible achievement for an industrial facility. This result can be attributed to a strong safety culture at the plant. Employees take a proactive approach to identifying and resolving safety concerns. They engage with Safety staff on a regular basis to identify areas for improvement. There is also a strong commitment to training and inspecting and maintaining facilities and equipment.

The new map can be found at www.a2gov.org/airquality and features a way to sign up for email alerts when AQI reaches the 'Unhealthy' level.

- **Business Rebates for Electric Leaf Blowers Reinstated:** Designed to help lower the cost of transitioning from gas to electric leaf blowers in accordance with Ann Arbor’s leaf blower ordinance, these rebates will be available to businesses that provide lawn care or landscaping services to properties located in Ann Arbor. These rebates will be available until September 30, 2026 or until funding is expended, and can be found at osi.a2gov.org/leafblowers.

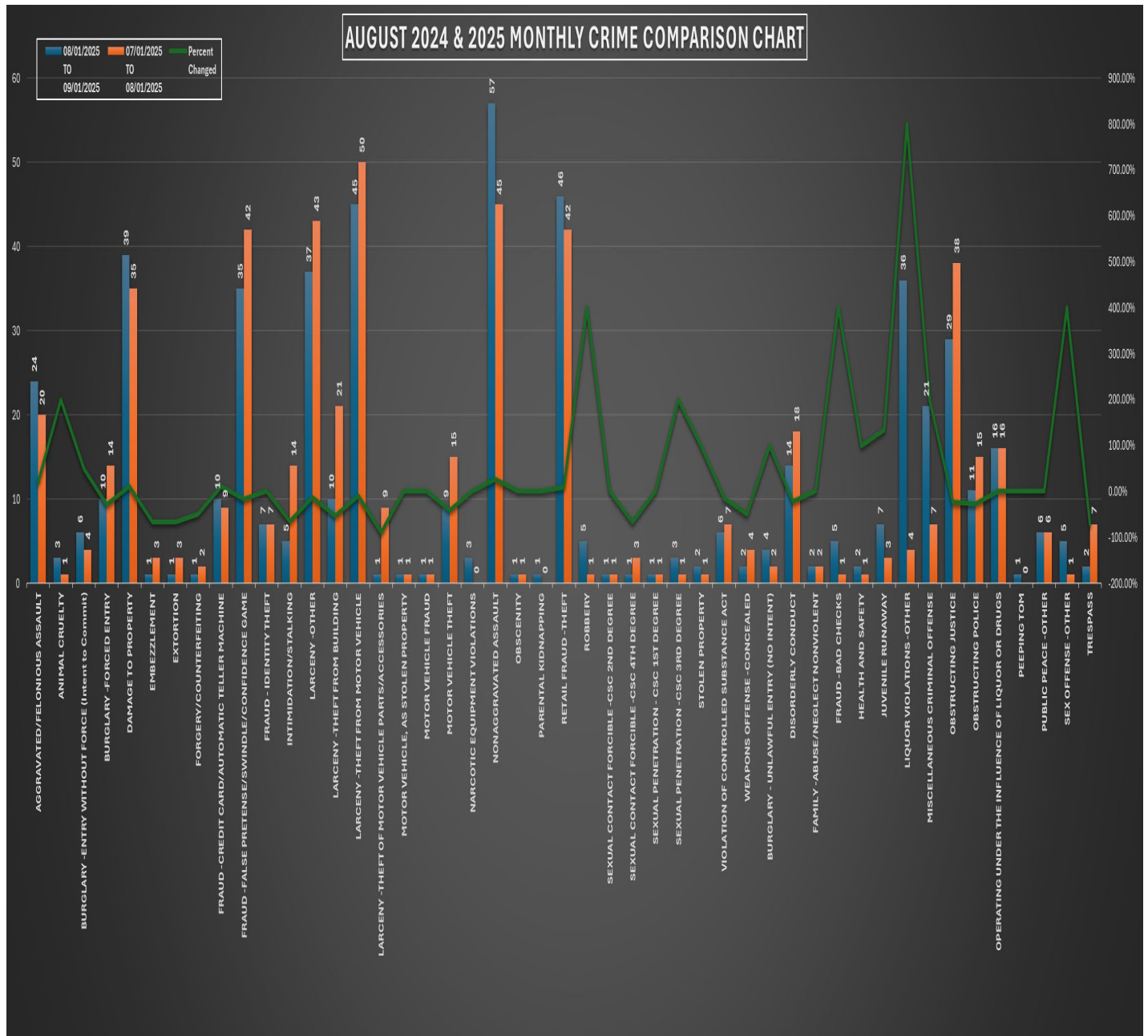

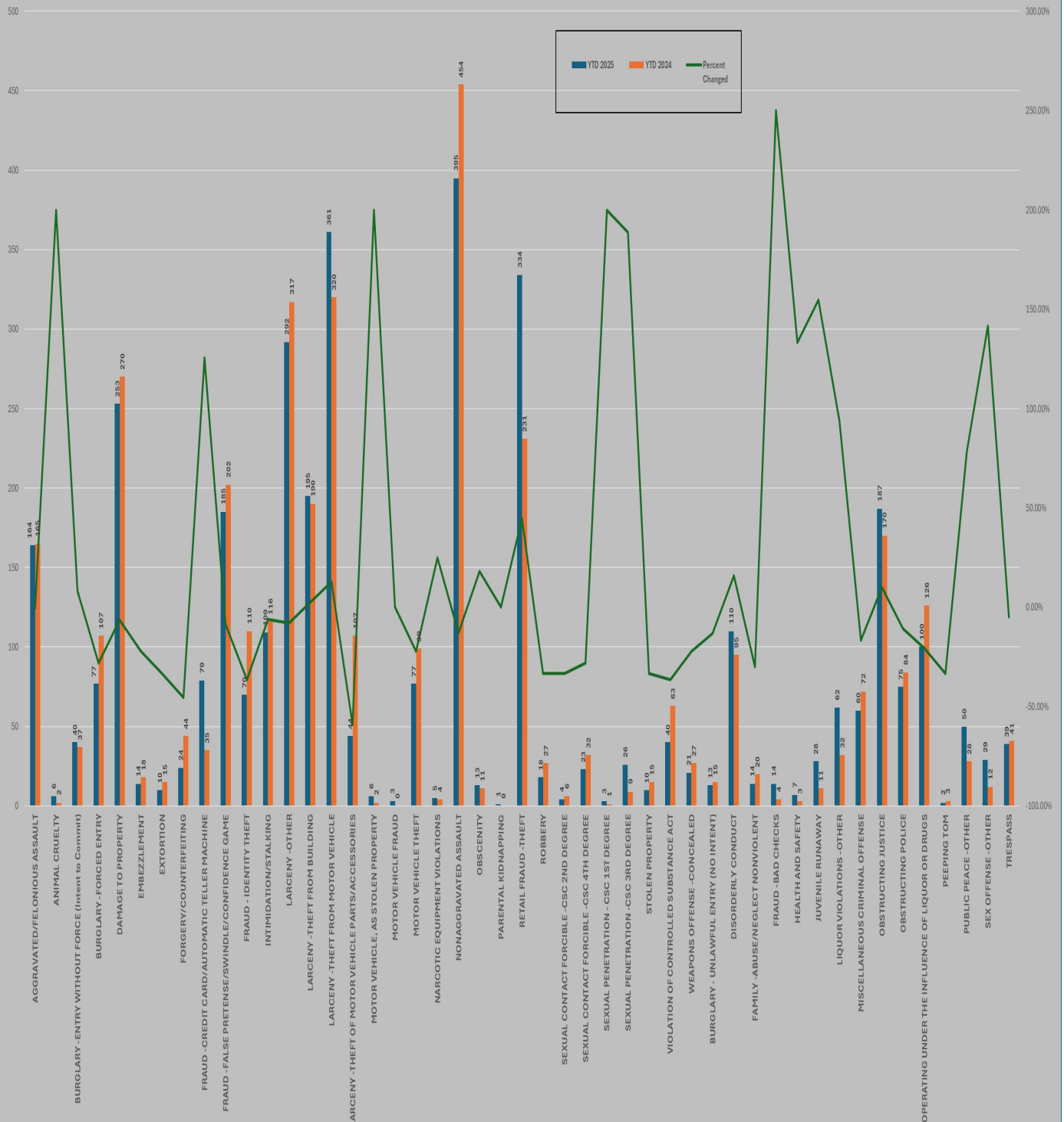
