Mayor Hieftje called the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron St.

1. **Thomas Partridge - Safe access to pedestrian transportation needed. Transportation improvement study of crosswalks including crosswalk sites on Washington and Plymouth Roads are very important. Access to safe affordable transportation and housing critically needed. (DC-1)**

Thomas Partridge, Ann Arbor resident, asked that Council consider the proposed Heritage Row Ordinance and Site Plan that was originally presented on tonight's agenda. He also addressed Council regarding safe access to pedestrian transportation and crosswalks, and access to safe affordable transportation and housing.

2. **William Hampton - NAACP**

William Hampton, 1184 Wendy Ct., announced that the NAACP will hold a Freedom Fund dinner on November 5, 2011 at 6:30 p.m. Several councilmembers are planning to attend. Councilmember Higgins will offer the welcome at the dinner and Mr. Hampton invited the rest of Council and the public to attend as well.

3. **Rita Mitchell - Heritage Row**

Rita Mitchell, 621 Fifth St., asked that Council take advantage of the opportunity afforded to them by Councilmembers Kunselman and Anglin to reconsider their votes on the City Place development in the 400 block of S. Fifth Ave. and to reset the process to a point that would allow multiple dimensions of a community benefit to be at the core of the Council's decision-making.

4. **Ethel Potts - City Place Development (DC-2)**

Ethel Potts, 1014 Elder Blvd., said that the historic houses on Fifth Avenue that are proposed to be demolished as part of the City Place project are well worth keeping and are an enhancement to the City. She asked that Council approve an historic district study committee and approve the proposed moratorium on the demolition of the seven historic homes.

5. **Kathy Boris - Historic Homes on the 400 Block of South 5th Ave.**

Kathy Boris, 1726 Charleston, spoke in support of the proposed resolutions to create an historic district study committee and a proposed moratorium on building and the demolition of the seven historic homes on Fifth Avenue.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin spoke about the rental inspection program and its effects on smaller scale landlords who may only have one home that they use for rental. He said that in some cases, the tone that the City may be sending out to the general public regarding rental inspections may be a little too harsh. Councilmember Anglin stated that the letters regarding inspections that are coming from staff may be more aggressive than is necessary and should be toned down.

COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere thanked City Administrator Steve Powers for standing at the entrance of City Hall this past Sunday before the Council Caucus meeting to greet

the public and Council and to make certain that everyone had access to the building. This past Sunday was not a regularly-scheduled Caucus meeting and the building was locked.

City Administrator Steve Powers reported on the following:

WASHTENAW COUNTY ROAD COMMISSION (WCRC)

The Washtenaw County Road Commission (WCRC) has approved a contract with the engineering consulting firm DLZ to design the intersection improvements at the State and Ellsworth Roads intersection. This will be the 2nd joint City-Road Commission "roundabout" intersection design and construction project.

The cost for the DLZ's project design will be paid for with the fees collected by the WCRC from the developer. The construction will be paid for mainly with an approved "Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ)" grant. Staff will meet soon with WCRC to review the scope of work and everyone's role in the project.
