SUBJECT: Neighborhood Watch Sign Progress Update

DATE: April 15, 2026

City Council approved Resolution #[R-25-457](#) on December 15, 2025, which required the removal of Neighborhood Watch signs throughout the city. This memorandum serves as the progress update, identifying the number of signs removed to date, remaining work, and any budgetary needs associated with completion, as required by April 15, 2026.

The removal of these signs supports the City's efforts to align its physical environment with its core values and evidence-based public safety practices that emphasize community connection rather than suspicion. The Ann Arbor Police Department supported this initiative, and the Transportation, and Signs and Signals teams were required to schedule and complete removals no later than July 15, 2026.

Between February 11 and March 31, 2026, all Neighborhood Watch signs, except one, have been removed. The final remaining sign is pending removal, with scheduling underway to document the process through video and photography.

To date, approximately \$16,500 has been allocated for the removal effort. No additional budgetary needs are anticipated to complete this project.
