Re: Public Art Enhancement Recommendations for FY2026-2031 CIP

Per Chapter 24 of the City Code, one of the primary responsibilities of the Ann Arbor Public Art Commission is to make recommendations to the City Council for capital investment projects which may be suitable for enhancement with public art. After discussions with City staff, to whom we offer thanks for their time and input, we present the following list for your consideration.

Once this report is formally accepted by the City Council, the acceptance will provide staff with authority to include the art enhancement in the project budget as it moves forward toward design and construction. As such, we strongly encourage your acceptance of this report. There are, of course, numerous other opportunities to refine the project budgets including the enhancement amounts as projects move toward reality.

We fully understand that this list is based on very limited information in the current Capital Improvements Plan. Some of the projects will not move ahead; others will end up with funding sources with which enhancement is not possible. That said, all of the following seem, based on what we know now, to be appropriate for enhancement. Where we have thoughts on an appropriate enhancement we have included that with each item. The suggested enhancement budgets wherever possible is recommended at about 1% of the project budget without enhancement following previous protocols and successful projects.

After review of the new CIP with staff, we have the following recommendations for upcoming new projects:

- **TR-SB-16-16** -- Ann (First St to Fifth) Resurfacing site previously reviewed for a street mural celebrating black-owned businesses and community that presided here for most of the 20th century. Previous requests had been for Black Lives Matter mural, but the commission is open to any public art pieces that are representative or recognize the history of the area.
- TR-AT-26-15 S. State at Southern Athletic Campus Crosswalk may recommend that U-M fund an art enhancement for this crosswalk. We understand that crosswalks have been off-limits in the past, but we'd like to see city staff and council reconsider these concerns based on recent research and case studies that show art in crosswalks actually reduces speeds and increases safety. - **TR-AT-26-16** Packard (Stadium to Stone School) Non-Motorized Improvements and Speed Management various opportunities for public art here including pedestrian island, crosswalk, and others.

• **OI-26-08** – Madison Transit Center -- may recommend that U-M fund an art enhancement - Transit centers have for many years been a common place for public art. Opportunity for mural, sculpture, light display, and numerous other types of public art projects to enhance the transit users experience.
