*Craig Hupy, Public Services Area Administrator; Connie Pulcifer, Systems Planner; and Linda Diane Feldt, Chair of the Pedestrian Safety and Access Task Force; presented the final report and recommendations of the Task Force to City Council. Copies of the report and presentation are on file in the City Clerk's Office. Task Force members Jim Rees and Owen Jansen also presented portions of the report and were available to answer questions.*

*Councilmembers asked staff for clarification regarding Police enforcement and whether implementation of some of the objectives identified would require additional Police resources.*

*Councilmember Grand requested more information and examples of "gateway signage" and how that might be implemented as part of the education component.*

*Councilmembers inquired about the Environmental Commission recommendation to move from salt to magnesium for snow and ice removal, due to environmental concerns. Questions were raised regarding the cost differences between the two options.*

**PUBLIC COMMENT - GENERAL (3 MINUTES EACH)**

*Sally Petersen, Chair of the Commission on Disability Issues, addressed three outstanding concerns she identified from the Task Force's final report:*

- 1. Question about Title II of the ADA and who actually has responsibility for sidewalk clearing. Ms. Petersen noted the City Attorney is researching this issue.*
- 2. Petersen raised a question about equity between City Hall and City residents, with the City clearing roads after 4 inches of snow accumulation, but requiring homeowners to clear at 1 inch.*
- 3. Petersen requested stronger language in support of those requesting assistance, either due to financial or physical needs.*

*Linda Evans, Vice Chair of the Commission on Disability Issues, urged Council to approve the funding of additional rumble strips at crosswalks.*

*Kathy Griswold, 2nd Ward, thanked the City for putting together the Task Force to really study this issue and she thanked Task Force members. She urged Council to continue with a "team" approach.*

*Chris Hewett, of the citizen group, Save Our Streets Ann Arbor, stated the current speeds on many Ann Arbor roads are too fast for most residents to feel comfortable in a bike lane. The higher speeds push cyclists back onto the sidewalks, he stated. He also requested uniformity with the signage and design of crosswalks throughout the City.*
