S. Rosencrans stated the Greenbelt Advisory Commission shares the millage with the Parks system and works closely with this Commission. NAP – Controlled Burn Program **D. Borneman** explained the controlled burn process to the Commission. **J. Lawter** expressed concern about the wildlife when controlled burns are taking place. **D. Borneman** explained the controlled burns are usually done as back burns and the smoke that is generated is carefully controlled to protect the wildlife. **K.
