Drinking Water

- Huron River intake on Barton Pond (~85%)
- Well Field (~15%)

Stormwater

Creek drainage from City

Drinking Water

- Threats to Upstream Huron River Water Quality
 - Industrial & Commercial
 - Tribar PFAS and Chromium-6 contaminations
 - ???Other NPDES permit holders??? Non-NPDES sources??

Agricultural

- Pesticides and Nutrients
 - Mostly from Arms & Boyden (49%), Mill (48%), Davis (41%), and Portage (33%) Creeks

Residential

- Consumer Goods and Nutrients
 - PFAS, Endocrine Disruptors, Pesticides

Stormwater

- Threats from Stormwater: Impervious Surfaces
 - Road Salt Chloride
 - Nutrients
 - Fertilizer Phosphorus and Nitrogen
 - Pet Wastes
 - Others
 - Petroleum products & Coal Tars
 - Miscellaneous Chemicals (Window Washing fluids, etc.)
 - Micro- and Nano-plastics

Groundwater

- Threats to Groundwater: Pervious surfaces
 - "Gelman" 1,4-Dioxane Plume
 - Chlorinated Solvents (TCE, etc.)
 - PFAS contaminations of Composts & Biosolids

Wastewaters & Biosolids

- Threats to Treated Wastewater and Biosolids Discharges
 - Industrial Pre-Treatment Permits (IPP)
 - University of Michigan
 - Legacy Landfill
 - Consumer Goods (PFAS, Endocrine Disruptors, Sunscreens, etc.)
