Attached please find follow-up items from the January 4 discussion of the Capital Improvements Plan (CIP) for Fiscal years 2024-2029:

- Updated presentation clearly noting the portion of "city-owned buildings" that applies to Ann Arbor Housing Commission Projects
- Staff replies to address how Transportation Commission recommendations have been incorporated

Additional information about Road Bond funding and active transportation project funding, as requested, is provided below. Commissioner questions are followed by staff replies.

Is bike infrastructure included in the road bond funding?

The Road Bond is intended primarily to improve pavement condition. Where there is an opportunity to add bike infrastructure on a street that is selected for Road Bond funding, that is done (Examples: Research Park Drive and Earhart Road).

Is there a prohibition of using the road bond funding toward bike infrastructure when that infrastructure is on the road where street improvements are being performed?

Are there intentional decisions by staff to use road bond funding on projects that do not include bike lanes?

No. Pavement Asset Management modeling has indicated that there is currently a greater need to "catch up" on the resurfacing of local resident streets. Thus, that is where much of the Road Bond funding has been focused. These happen to be lower volume streets where dedicated bike infrastructure is not typically installed.

What recommendations would be helpful from the Planning Commission to ensure that bike infrastructure will come along with road infrastructure when improvements are made?

None are necessary. This is already covered by the Moving Together Towards Vision Zero Transportation Plan, and staff reviews every major road project that is done for the inclusion of the appropriate bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure. CIP project scopes for major road projects reflect the necessary bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure to be incorporated as part of the project.

What is the CIP and why do we need it?


- A schedule of public service expenditures over a six-year period

- Required by the State of Michigan Act 33 of the Public Acts of 2008
- Completed annually:
 - Full update to all six years Even Years
 - Modification to first 2 plan years Odd Years



What is a Capital Project?

Physical projects for city infrastructure and assets that are greater than \$100,000

Studies greater than \$50,000 that will lead to physical projects




- Not operations and maintenance
- Not private development






