Bike/ped crossings and US-23

The Michigan Department of Transportation has started the environmental assessment (EA) process for improvements to US-23 between M-14 and I-94. While the EA will largely be focused on the freeway operations, MDOT owns and controls all interchanges, underpasses, and overpasses that intersect with US-23 – of which there are 8 on the east side of the City. The freeways around Ann Arbor, including US-23, present significant barriers to non-motorized travel. Staff has drafted a resolution for the Transportation Commission's consideration which urges MDOT to address these non-motorized connections as part of the US-23 project. Speed Management Program Update

One of the deliverables that was developed as part of the Vision Zero Implementation Strategy was the Speed Management Program. This program is focused on slowing down traffic on major roadways – like traffic calming on arterials and collectors. Staff will work on designs with a consultant this winter in the hopes of select deployments next year. Staff will review the program and answer questions.
