VI.A.) Trunkline Transfer Study (Trevor Brydon)(30 Minutes)

24-0248 Trunkline Transfer Study

Commissioner questions and comments:

• Low benefit-cost ratio of Jackson Ave. but there is a high danger level.

• Proposal to take over roads for greater freedom in implementing improvements.

• Proposal to reduce7 lanes on Jackson Ave.,

• Clarification on state responsibility for road conditions before turnover to the city.

- The city will inherit maintenance costs upon ownership transfer.
- Absence of estimates for reconstruction costs in the study.
- Requirement to accept all road segments upon ownership transfer.
- Discussion of the ownership transfer process and hypothetical timeline (5 years).

• Inquiry into negotiating the reconstruction concurrently with the ownership transfer.

- Concerns about contradictions with city core goals.
- Consideration of additional analysis needed for negotiations with MDOT, including historical road data.

A motion was made by Kleinman, seconded by Houk, to recommend that the City Council initiate the trunk line transfer process with all of the current MDOT-controlled roads. The Chair declared the motion carried with six votes in favor of the recommendation and two abstaining votes. The commission approved the motion and forwarded it to The City Council due on 4/1/2024.
