Ann Arbor Public Art Commission Guidelines review and redraft

Summary: The Public Art Ordinance was amended on June 6, 2013. There are processes in the Guidelines that refer to items in the Ordinance that have become obsolete because of the amendment, there are processes that have been practiced by the Public Art Commission that are not outlined in the Guidelines, and there are possibly additional procedures to consider including.

To complete a revision of the Guidelines several steps are recommended:

- Form an ad hoc Committee to facilitate a redraft and to present a final draft to the Commission
- Complete a review of applicable Guidelines and documents from other public art programs to inform the process
- Request the appropriate city staff provide input and vet the content
- Engage the public
- Acquire the approval of the changes to the Guidelines from City Council, following AAPAC's approval

The ad hoc Committee will work with the Public Art Administrator and city staff to develop the content. This may require several meetings with staff before a final draft is completed for the Commission's approval. Targeting the completion of a final draft before the end of the calendar year will allow the changes to the Guidelines to be in place before annual planning is due in February.
