CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Hieftje called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron St.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

TRICK OR TREAT PADDLE

City Administrator Steve Powers announced that a Trick or Treat Paddle was held on October 20, 2013 at Gallup Park. Approximately 450 people attended. Seventy seven volunteers from fraternities and sororities entertained the public. The volunteers dressed up as trolls, swamp monsters, witches, as well as fishes and pirates. He noted that the event was a success.

INTERNATIONAL RECOGNITION

Steve Powers recognized Community Services Area Administrator Sumedh Bahl, who introduced two guests to the City, Mr. Wicha Chanklom from Thailand and Mr. Yubao Xue from China. Mr. Chanklom and Mr. Xue are a part of the International Fellows Program through ICMA. There are approximately 30 countries involved in the exchange program. Their main goal for this visit is to learn about the legislative process, transparency, and awareness in the context of local government management and citizen engagement. 1. Tom Partridge - Write in Tom Partridge for 5th Ward City Council. Reform City government and the DDA. Provide affordable access to City and County public transportation.

Tom Partridge, Ann Arbor resident, addressed Council regarding his candidacy as a write-in for 5th Ward City Council. He also addressed Council regarding reforming the DDA and City government and providing affordable access to City and County public transportation.

2. Rita Mitchell - Resolution Approving a Professional Services Agreement with URS Corporation, Inc. (DS-3)

Rita Mitchell, 621 5th St., addressed Council regarding the Resolution Approving a Professional Services Agreement with URS Corporation, Inc. She expressed concern with Section 2.2 of the contract and asked that Council include citizen groups representing all sides of the issue as they move forward with this project.

3. Martha Valadez - Resolution to Approve Amendment No. 3 to the Articles of Incorporation of the Ann Arbor Area Transportation Authority (DC-1)

Martha Valadez, 212 Woodward St., in Ypsilanti, Michigan, spoke in support of the proposed Resolution to Approve Amendment No. 3 to the Articles of Incorporation of the Ann Arbor Area Transportation Authority. She said that access to public transportation is a critical need for the entire community.

4. Matt Vanauker - Resolution to Approve Amendment No. 3 to the Articles of Incorporation of the Ann Arbor Area Transportation Authority (DC-1)

Matt Vanauker, 727 Miller Ave., Apt. 204, spoke in support of the proposed Resolution to Approve Amendment No. 3 to the Articles of Incorporation of the Ann Arbor Area Transportation Authority. He said that public transportation is absolutely imperative for people without vehicles.

5. Nancy Shiffler - Resolution Approving a Professional Services Agreement with URS Corporation, Inc. (DS-3)

Nancy Shiffler, 2877 Sorrento Ave., addressed Council regarding the proposed Resolution Approving a Professional Services Agreement with URS Corporation, Inc. She spoke in support of more public involvement in the process. Ms. Shiffler also expressed concern with the possibility that any City parkland would be used for the train station relocation.

6. Mike Shriberg - Resolution to Urge City of Ann Arbor Employees' Retirement System to Divest from the Top 200 Publicly-Traded Fossil Fuel Companies (DC-2)

Mike Shriberg, 1473 Pine Valley Blvd., addressed Council regarding the Resolution to Urge the City of Ann Arbor Employees' Retirement System to Divest from the Top 200 Publicly-Traded Fossil Fuel Companies and urged Council to follow the advice of the Energy Commission and pass the proposed resolution.

7. Clark Charnetski - Resolution Approving a Professional Services Agreement with URS Corporation, Inc. (DS-3)

Clark Charnetski, 2646 Traver Blvd., spoke in support of the proposed Resolution Approving a Professional Services Agreement with URS Corporation, Inc. He encouraged Council to support the resolution.

8. Abishek Thiagaraj - Resolution to Approve Amendment No. 3 to the Articles of Incorporation of the Ann Arbor Area Transportation Authority (DC-1)

Abishek Thiagaraj, 721 S. Forest Ave., #305, spoke in support of the proposed Resolution to Approve Amendment No. 3 to the Articles of Incorporation of the Ann Arbor Area Transportation Authority.

9. Jeff Hayner - Resolution Approving a Professional Services Agreement with URS Corporation, Inc. (DS-3)

Jeff Hayner, 1807 Pontiac Trail., spoke in support of the proposed Resolution to Approve a Contract with Keystone Medial LLC to Redesign the City's Website. He said a website redesign is long overdue and the current site is difficult for many to navigate. He also addressed the issue of public involvement in the train station project. He encouraged Council to consider more ways for the public to participate in this process.

10. Drew Waller - Resolution Approving a Professional Services Agreement with URS Corporation, Inc. (DS-3)

Drew Waller, 603 E. Liberty, addressed Council regarding the motion to reconsider the appointment of AI McWilliams to the DDA. He said that it is important that the people being appointed to the DDA are the right people and he felt that Mr. McWilliams was a good addition to the DDA as he has very successfully brought opportunities to the downtown through his work.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER PETERSEN

Councilmember Petersen spoke about ethics and conflict of interest. She stated these issues have entered the Council's discussion over the last few months. Councilmember Petersen said she has discussed the issue of ethics and conflict of interest with her constituents and she thinks there is public support for a Council ethics policy. Councilmember Petersen stated she will be bringing forward an ethics policy at the next Council meeting for Council to consider for adoption. She stated she welcomes any co-sponsors.

In the interest of community and public engagement, the Ward 2 Citizens Satisfaction Study has been re-launched. A few more questions about the city website and the ability for residents to navigate it have been added. There is also an open-ended question about pedestrian safety on Plymouth Road. She welcomed all City residents to take the survey, not just those in Ward 2.

Councilmember Petersen recognized the Ann Arbor Huron High School River Rats Men's Tennis Team. They won their third straight State championship this past weekend.

COUNCILMEMER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin congratulated City Administrator Steve Powers for his work over the last few years in the City. Councilmember Anglin stated that Mr. Powers presence and influence has been profound. He thanked him for his hard work and dedication, stating he appreciated Mr. Powers' visibility in the public and at events and for the transparency in his office.

COUNCILMEMER TEALL

Councilmember Teall recognized the Ann Arbor Housing Commission and Director Jennifer Hall. She stated the Housing Commission has been listed on the website for the U.S. Interagency Council on Homelessness for their best practices regarding the special waitlist.

COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm concurred with Councilmember Anglin regarding the good work of City Administrator Steve Powers and staff. Councilmember Lumm stated both 2nd and 1st Ward residents were appreciative of the recent meeting at Clague Middle School that was well planned and conducted by staff to address the DhuVarren/Green/Nixon Road intersection project.

COUNCILMEMBER KUNSELMAN

Councilmember Kunselman announced that a public meeting notice was sent out to the Springwater Subdivision regarding a public improvement project. A public meeting has been scheduled for October 30, 2013 from 6:30 to 8:00 p.m., in the cafeteria of Scarlett Middle School to gather resident feedback about a proposed improvement project which would result in extensive street reconstruction, stormwater improvements in the neighborhood, as well as sidewalk expansion being considered. The meeting is planned as an advance opportunity for residents to provide input into the project as it is being shaped.

COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski gave thanks to Councilmember Kailasapathy for bringing forward the proclamation honoring Diwali. It was a good opportunity to acknowledge the South Asian community, he stated.

Councilmember Warpehoski said that public process works best when people have an opportunity to give input earlier rather than later. He said he would be working with staff to explore the creation of an outdoor smoking ordinance. This would mirror the existing County ordinance that limits where smoking may be conducted outdoors, such as away from building entrances, ventilation of transit stations, etc. It would be a tool that the City would have since they are not empowered to enforce the County ordinance. This ordinance would also empower the City Administrator to designate sections of City parks either part or whole as non-smoking areas.

Councilmembers Warpehoski and Briere are working on a resolution that would create a Citizens Advisory Committee on Pedestrian Safety. Councilmember Warpehoski said that the Federal Highway Authority has a framework on how to develop a Safety Action Plan and it is his understanding that City staff are moving forward with a proposal to implement that framework.

COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere also spoke about the creation of a Citizens Advisory Committee on Pedestrian Safety. She stated she and Councilmember Warpehoski are considering the make-up of the committee, including members of the disability community and school groups. She stated those interested in serving on the committee should contact the Mayor's Office to apply once the committee has been created.

COUNCILMEMBER TAYLOR

Councilmember Taylor spoke about the new digital billboard at Michigan Stadium along Stadium Boulevard. He stated that this billboard, although the University is not bound by City Ordinance, is in conflict with many of the standards set out by the City when the updates to the City Sign Ordinance were passed, including its large size. Councilmember Taylor stated that he and Councilmembers Higgins and Teall will be sponsoring a resolution at the next Council meeting requesting that the University decommission the billboard. If the University will not remove it, he stated at a minimum they would like to request that its use be limited to times when events were taking place either at the stadium or at Crisler Arena. Councilmember Taylor encouraged other councilmembers to contact him to co-sponsor the resolution.

The Parks Advisory Committee had a subcommittee working for a number of months discussing the downtown parks at the request of City Council. The subcommittee recommendations have been forwarded to PAC and have been approved and are included as a communication in the October 21, 2013 Council packet. A resolution would be brought forward at the next meeting accepting those recommendations.
