Road Conditions are Unsafe

Dear Sabra,

Thank you for your periodic updates via email. I find them informative and appreciate that you take the time to write them.

I have read the information online about the City's strategy for dealing with ice and snow. Whatever they have—or haven't—done, it seems that the road conditions around Ann Arbor are still very treacherous, 48 hours after Saturday's storm. I was quite surprised at how even major streets like Plymouth Road, Maple Road, and Newport Road still had much snow debris on them today, Monday. This evening, many roads are quite slick, I could feel the car sliding quite a bit, and the antilock brakes kicked on frequently. We are supposed to get another inch or two tonight. I think Tuesday's roads are going to be unnecessarily treacherous.

I appreciate the fact the city is trying to be green, but it shouldn't be at the expense of safety.

Since I mentioned being "green", I also wanted to write to express strong support for modifying the city's ordinance requiring cars to stop for pedestrians waiting to cross. A tremendous amount of energy is wasted when multiple cars must come to a complete stop for a single pedestrian, and then have to accelerate to driving speeds again. I drive Plymouth Road several times daily and think this is frankly ridiculous. The law is too imbalanced in favor of pedestrians. It's not unreasonable to have them wait a few moments until a group of cars moves along. Keep the Hawk lights, but perhaps they can be programmed to monitor car traffic and let the lights activate only after they sense a gap in the traffic.

One last traffic-related item, while I am thinking about it. It upsets me to see money being spent to put in permanent speed-check monitors, especially when they are in immediate proximity of deteriorating roads (again I reference Plymouth Road). The condition of so many of our city roads going into winter is horrible, and I think this winter is really going to chew them up. It's unfortunate that opportunities to patch up some roads in Autumn were missed. We are all going to pay for it come late winter.

Thank you for co-sponsoring this resolution. When we met, I meant to talk to you about this, and forgot to share with you our plan to provide 24-hour front door coverage at Miller Manor as part of the AAHC's entire portfolio redevelopment. I have requested a council work session in February 2014 to update you on these plans, but I thought I should give you a heads up now, due to the timing of the council resolution.

We are working with Avalon, Catholic Social Services, the VA, Ozone House, and CSTS (formally Community Mental Health) to provide full-time case management services at Miller Manor so that we can successfully house homeless and other special needs populations for the community. A 24-hour front desk is critical for this project to succeed, which has been missing in the community since the Y was torn down.

I am in the process of applying for funding for services and we think the cost will be about \$725,000/year to provide these services (case management and 24 hour front desk). We are pretty confident we can raise about \$450,000/yr starting in early 2014 and we are working on long-term funding to cover the entire amount, but we will need a year or two to make that happen.

I will be asking City Council to use some of the proceeds from the sale of the Y lot to help cover the service funding gap of \$275,000/year for the first two years, until we secure all of the funding that is needed.

I understand that providing 24 hour coverage and case management at Miller is not adding new units, however, it is adding new units for the most vulnerable and difficult to serve tenants in the community, who would otherwise not be able to be housed. And, through the RAD redevelopment process, the AAHC is planning on developing 40+ additional units to the local affordable housing stock at other sites. And, as you know, there is a good chance we (someone in the community) will be able to add affordable units to the County-owned Platt road site that will likely not be targeting chronically homeless and other difficult to serve tenants.

I am happy to discuss this with you in more detail, but I am on the HHSAB agenda in January and by the February work session, I will have more information, as we are still working on finalizing the details right now.
