Dear Mayor Hieftje and Members of City Council,

I'm writing to express my interest in the open seat of Ann Arbor's Environmental Commission. I have lived in the Ann Arbor area for almost seven years, and have been a homeowner in the City since May of 2012. I'm extremely passionate about the environment, and have dedicated my career to promoting sustainability and helping others reduce their impact on the environment.

I began my tenure at the local nonprofit Clean Energy Coalition (CEC) as a volunteer while studying at Eastern Michigan University in 2010. After then completing an internship, I was hired as a full-time employee in early 2011. Since starting at CEC, I've worked on many projects and have gained significant experience working on sustainability, energy efficiency, and renewable energy issues in the southeast Michigan area.

In 2011, CEC worked with the City of Detroit on a number of sustainability projects, including partnering with the City's Department of Public Works to improve its solid waste and recycling programs. My work involved convening and leading stakeholders to assess needs, auditing recycling carts to determine the current program's state, developing priorities for improvement, and creating and distributing outreach and educational materials to teach residents on how to recycle in Detroit.

I also assisted with the development of the Ann Arbor Climate Action Plan by coordinating stakeholder meetings and communications among stakeholders, generating portions of the Plan related to resource management, and creating tools for stakeholder participants to access key information to move the project forward.

In 2012, I researched national best practices and identified barriers to installing solar in Michigan's Great Lakes Bay Region. This included evaluating and addressing current inefficiencies and obstacles in permitting procedures, solar and zoning ordinances, and application processes. I was part of a team that developed recommendations to minimize these barriers and increase solar adoption in commercial and residential sectors.

Since 2013, I have played a lead role in managing and implementing HEAL MI, which is a program designed by the Clinton Foundation that partners with employers to help their employees become more energy efficient in their homes. CEC was one of the Clinton Climate Initiative's first partners to replicate HEAL outside of Arkansas. The program offers employees free home energy audits to employees and individual technical assistance throughout the process. My role has been to act as an "energy liaison" between the employee/homeowner and the contractor performing the energy audits and retrofits, explaining the results of the energy audit and how an energy efficiency retrofit would benefit their homes. In addition, I created the vast majority of the program's outreach tools and materials, and was responsible for tracking and compiling data analytics to identify areas for improvement and efficiency throughout the program. CEC worked with Zingerman's Community of Businesses and the City of Ann Arbor on the pilot program, which was funded by DTE Energy.

My experience and insight would be a valuable asset to the Commission. It would be an honor to serve on the Environmental Commission and to further Ann Arbor's sustainability goals, and I hope you will consider me for this opportunity.
