City Administrator Steve Powers updated Council on the following:

Tom Partridge, City resident, spoke in opposition to the proposed changes to the City Council Rules.

3. Kermit Schlansker - Greenhouses and Solar Mirrors

Kermit Schlansker spoke about solar power and the need for sustainable energy sources.

4. Katherine Wilkerson - FOIA Rosser Killing

Katherine Wilkerson spoke about the recent public protest and march in Ann Arbor and the nationwide attention to police brutality and race issues. She stated the identity of the Ann Arbor Police officer who shot and killed Aura Rosser must be identified for the public.

5. Lefiest Galimore - Recent Police Shooting

Lefiest Galimore urged Council to establish a citizen review board for Police issues. He stated the police cannot police themselves and there needs to be oversight.

6. Kathy Griswold - Funding for Pedestrian Safety

Kathy Griswold, 3565 Fox Hunt, reminded Council and the public that the annual Kiwanis holiday sale would be held this coming Friday and Saturday. She also asked Council to fully fund pedestrian safety improvements in the upcoming budget. Ms. Griswold thanked City staff for the responsiveness of the City to requests made using the A2 FixIt software.

7. Steve Carnes - Councilmember Kunselman

Steve Carnes spoke about comments made by Councilmember Kunselman at the November 17 City Council meeting regarding the eviction of homeless camps in Ann Arbor.

8. Caleb Poirier - Video from November 17, 2014 City Council Meeting at a2gov.legistar.com/calendar.aspx

Caleb Poirier, 2721 Braeburn Circle, addressed the comments made by Councilmember Kunselman at the November 17 Council meeting, regarding the homeless camps on Burton Road and other sites in the City. He stated the homeless community plans to lead the effort to have Mr. Kunselman recalled.

9. Margaret Traeger - Antibiotic Use on Farms

Margaret Traeger spoke about the danger of using antibiotics on farms and in the food supply. She urged Council to support the ban of antibiotics for any use other than for medical purposes.

2. Alan Haber - Adoption of Council Rules (DC-1)

(There was general consensus that Mr. Haber, arriving late, would be given his speaking time that was previously missed.)

Alan Haber, 531 Third Street, expressed concern regarding the changes to the public comment rules that are proposed with the Council Rules revisions. He urged Council to support and encourage public participation.

CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere responded to Mr. Haber's comments regarding public comment and engagement with the public. Councilmember Briere stated she is supportive of a dialogue regarding public comment and she encouraged more communication with the public and Council.

COUNCILMEMBER KAILASAPATHY

Councilmember Kailasapathy stated there is a public meeting at Clague Middle School on December 11 from 6 to 8 p.m., regarding the Dhu Varren/Nixon/Green Road improvement project.

COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski spoke about the recent shooting death of a civilian by an Ann Arbor Police officer. He urged patience from the public during the investigation.

COUNCILMEMBER KUNSELMAN

Councilmember Kunselman responded to the public comments regarding his previous remarks regarding homeless camps around town. He stated he stands by his comments that the homeless camps are illegal and on private property and should not be allowed to continue. He stated the more humane solution is to not allow folks to camp in the freezing cold winter.

COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm thanked Councilmember Kunselman for the clarification.

Councilmember Lumm stated there is a Deer Management meeting at Huron High School on December 10 from 7 to 9 p.m.

COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand stated she now has the following office hours for residents to talk with her on Tuesdays at 9 a.m.:
