## CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Taylor called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron Street.

#### AC COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR

STATEWIDE ELECTION

*City Administrator Steve Powers reminded the public that Tuesday, May 5, 2015 was the Statewide Special Election. All city polling places would be open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m. A State proposal and an Ann Arbor Public Schools bond proposal are on the ballot.* 

*Mr.* Powers also announced that as part of the Election, Ann Arbor was one of five municipalities participating in a pilot project with the State Bureau of Elections. Ann Arbor is trying out a dual Electronic Poll Book at Precinct 5-3. The dual pollbook pilot will test the use of two laptop computers for voter check-in, with the goal of reducing long lines and check-in times at major elections such as the upcoming Presidential Election in 2016.

#### EARTH DAY

On April 22, 2015 in celebration of Earth Day, the Natural Area Preservation program hosted a work day that attracted over 400 volunteers. The volunteers were students and teachers who volunteered to pull the invasive plant species, garlic mustard, from eight different City parks. They were helped by 9 work-day leaders and 10 city staff members.

#### OPEN HOUSE AT THE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

On May 9, 2015 from 11 a.m. until 3 p.m., the City will be hosting an open house at the Water Treatment Plant on 919 Sunset Road in Ann Arbor. Guests will get an up-close look at what makes Ann Arbor's drinking water flow.

#### 1. Larry Baird - Border to Border Resolution (DC-1)

Larry Baird, 1770 Riverwood Dr., addressed Council regarding the importance of the proposed Border-to-Border Trail resolution. Mr. Baird also shared frustrations with the planning process as it relates to the intersection at Maiden Lane and Fuller Road.

### 2. Gwen Nystuen - Border to Border Resolution (DC-1)

*Gwen Nystuen, 1016 Olivia, spoke in support of the proposed Border-to-Border Trail resolution. She urged Council to support this resolution to complete an important section of the trail.* 

#### 3. Larry Deck - Border to Border Resolution (DC-1)

Larry Deck, 3050 Lorraine, spoke in support of the proposed Border-to-Border Trail resolution. He said that the Border-to-Border Trail is a part of the proposed statewide 2,000 mile Iron Belle trail system.

#### 4. Bob Krzewinski - Border to Border Resolution (DC-1)

Bob Krzewinski, 706 Dwight St., Ypsilanti, Michigan, member of the Friends of the Border-to-Border Trail, spoke in support of the proposed resolution. He said that getting nonmotorized users off the road areas and onto the trail is needed at the Maiden Lane and Fuller Road intersection. The border to border link in Ann Arbor helps to complete the Iron Belle Trail in Michigan.

## 5. Jeff Hayner - Mayor Appointments to Boards and Commissions (MC-1, MC-2)

Jeff Hayner, 1807 Pontiac Tr., addressed Council regarding the boards and commissions appointment and reappointment process. He noted that many Councilmembers and other board members are long serving and have served on many different boards. He stated it is important to find new and diverse people to serve.

#### 6. Blaine Coleman - Stop Bombing Yemen

Blaine Coleman, P. O. Box 7038, expressed concern with the bombing in Yemen and asked Council to take a stand on the issue.

#### 7. Mozhan Savabieasfahani - Stop Bombing Yemen

Mozhan Savabieasfahani , P. O. Box 7038, expressed concern with the bombing in Yemen and urged Council to take action.

## 8. Kermit Schlansker - Multiple Product Factories

Kermit Schlansker, 2060 Marshall, addressed Council regarding local governments learning how to create jobs by creating multiple product factories. Full employment is needed to lower the cost of crime, welfare and unemployment benefits.

#### CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

#### COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand reminded the public that tomorrow's May 5 Special Election ballot includes a bond proposal for the Ann Arbor Public Schools. She urged voters to approve this bond, noting that it would not raise taxes; it is status quo and supports critical needs in terms of infrastructure and arts for children.

Councilmember Grand said that she would be providing a substitute resolution for DC-1 on tonight's agenda, regarding the completion of a segment of the border-to-border trail. Councilmember Grand stated she also planned to bring forward amendments for the budget on May 18, including additional funding for Veteran's Court, traffic calming measures, and recommendations regarding the Housing Commission.

#### COUNCILMEMBER BRIERE

Councilmember Briere announced new historic markers have been placed on the parking structure that the University of Michigan built on Maiden Lane. The public can attend an event showcasing the markers and Ann Arbor's history on May 6, 2015, at 11:30 a.m. at the parking structure.

Councilmember Briere said that a green home tour was scheduled for May 9, 2015 from 12-4 p.m. It is a tour of four single-family homes that people have made energy efficient. She said that tickets were available at greenhometour.blogspot.com. She urged interested folks to attend.

#### COUNCILMEMBER ANGLIN

Councilmember Anglin thanked those who helped organize the Waterhill Music Festival over the past weekend and those who attended and made it a neighborhood success.

Councilmember Anglin expressed concern with the use of storm water funds to support the maintenance of trees.

#### COUNCILMEMBER WARPEHOSKI

Councilmember Warpehoski reminded Council of the Election on May 5, and suggested that Councilmembers be brief in their discussion tonight, recognizing that the City Clerk and other staff would be working long hours on Election Day.

In response to public comments, Councilmember Warpehoski noted that in 2002, Council passed a resolution in opposition to the war in Iraq and in 2007 Council passed a resolution supporting humanitarian aid and drinking water programs to support the people of Iraq.

#### COUNCILMEMEBR LUMM

Councilmember Lumm thanked Councilmember Warpehoski for the reminder of the Election on May 5. The City Clerk and her staff also worked over the weekend in preparation for the Election, she noted.

Councilmember Lumm replied to comments made about stormwater and trees. She said that the urban forestry management plan speaks to what they should be doing when engineering new road designs in terms of tree protection. This is another value that needs to be kept in mind whenever projects are planned and approved.

		Chris Hewitt, representing Save Our Streets Ann Arbor, asked that the City consider small improvements that are greatly needed regarding sidewalk and speed changes to S. Seventh Street.
		Edward Vielmetti, 1210 Brooklyn, asked if there was any movement by the City to replace the fiber infrastructure currently offered by Comcast. He stated the City has an opportunity to be a leader in this area.

*Elizabeth Roden, resident of the Waterhill neighborhood, spoke in support of the City's allocation of \$25,000 for a consultant to examine the use of accessory dwelling units as part of the City's zoning code.* 

Jeff Hayner, 1807 Pontiac Trail, spoke in support of accessory dwelling units, stating they are long overdue in the City. He spoke in opposition to funding a deer cull.

Kathy Griswold, 3565 Fox Hunt Dr., urged Council to support a budget that is consistent with the community's values.

Jonathan Levine, 456 Hilldale, spoke in support of a budget allocation for a consultant to study accessory dwelling units. He said that expanding housing supply would expand the opportunity for transportation alternatives.

Susan Hutton, chair of the Environmental Commission, urged Council to support an amendment to fund an existing position that is responsible for the support of the City's Sustainability Framework. She stated that in order for the City to meet the goals established in their plans, a staff person needs to be funded.

Joe O'Neal, 1920 Scottwood, of the Allen Creek Conservancy, encouraged Council to vote for a consultant to support the Greenway Conservancy's efforts.

Wayne Appleyard, chair of the Energy Commission, asked Council to amend the budget to fund the sustainability associate position.

Mark Clevey, vice chair of the Energy Commission, spoke in support of the Budget Resolution and asked Council to consider funding the sustainability associate position.
