

Washtenaw County Zero:2016 JUNE DATA REPORT

ZERO: 2016 INITIATIVE

In January 2015, Washtenaw County joined 74 other communities across the country when it launched its participation in the Zero:2016 Initiative,

a national movement to end veteran and chronic homelessness by the end of 2016.

ZERO-DEFINED

The goal of Zero: 2016 is to end homelessness by reaching a "functional zero" count.

Functional zero is reached when, at any point in time, the number of people (veterans or chronic) experiencing sheltered and unsheltered homelessness will be no greater than the current monthly housing placement rate for that population (veterans or chronic).

OVERALL GOAL


- House 153 homeless veterans by the end of 2015
- House 121 chronically homeless individuals by the end of 2016

MONTHLY GOAL


In order to end veteran and chronic homelessness in Washtenaw County by the end of 2016, monthly we must house—on average:

- 13 veterans
- 5 chronically homeless
