# 1. Peter Houk - Improvements to Geddes Ave. (DS-1)

Peter Houk, 2025 Yoman, a member of the Washtenaw Coalition on Walking and Bicycling, spoke in support of a "Complete Streets" plan.

# 2. Judith Mich - Election Reform Proposals (DC-4, 5, & 7)

Judith Mich, 915 Sunset Road, representing the League of Women Voters, spoke in support of election reform in the City, stating less election dates would promote greater voter turnout.

# 3. Reymond Beveridge - Geddes Ave. Improvements (DS-1)

Reymond Beveridge, 2651 Geddes, thanked Councilmember Jane Lumm for working with the residents regarding the Geddes Avenue improvements. He stated Council needs to prioritize City projects.

# 4. David Canter - Airport Runway Extension (DC-2)

David Canter, 23 Harvard Place, expressed concern about DC-2, stating the City should not give away any of its power to Pittsfield Township.

## 5. John Chamberlin - Election Reform Proposals (DC-4, 5, & 7)

John Chamberlain, 315 Second St, spoke in support of reforming Council elections to include four-year terms in even years only. He stated he did not support a change from partisan to non-partisan elections, however.

# 6. Jonathon Bulkley - Stormwater and Flood Ordinance

Jonathon Bulkley, 1915 Scottwood Ave, spoke in support of Resolution DC-3.

## 7. Alissa Beveridge - Geddes Ave. Improvements - Lack of City Vision and Cost (DS-1)

Alissa Beveridge, 2651 Geddes Ave., expressed her frustration with the costs of the proposed Geddes Avenue improvement project, particularly those costs that will be passed on to the local residents. She spoke in opposition to the project.
