Program Components Description

Peace Neighborhood Center's Alternatives for Youth program is a year-round comprehensive series of interlocking services specifically designed for economically disadvantaged middle-school aged youth from 6th through 9th grade to promote positive youth development, leadership and high school graduation. The entirety of the program consists of the school-year Alternatives for Youth after school program, the STARS Mentorship for Girls program, the Rising Sons Mentorship for Boys program and the six-week summer program known as Leadership Development Camp. These four services provide wrap-around support to this vulnerable age group in order to promote academic, social and emotional success especially during the difficult transitions between elementary and middle school as well as between middle school and high school. The program design is based on the Positive Youth Development Model as defined by the National Center of Children in Poverty. Peace also works closely with Ann Arbor Public Schools in order to align both its tutoring approach and program curriculum with those of the school district. By providing a structured study environment, enrichment activities, character development, tutoring and mentoring, Peace promotes success in school,

development of social skills, and a sense of the benefits of community service. Special emphasis is given to teaching the necessary social and study skills that have the greatest impact on high school graduation rates including a focus on literacy skills, school attendance, test preparation, academic retention during the summer period and consistent engagement with family members to foster a supportive environment at home.
