6. Angela Davis - Y17 Winter Parking Restrictions - Pilot Program

Angela Davis, 2073 Garden Circle, expressed concerns about the City's Winter Parking Restrictions pilot program, stating parking restrictions are not necessary on Garden Circle, a small cul-de-sac.

7. Robert McGee - Deer

Robert McGee, 2245 Placid Way, updated City Council and the public regarding the recently concluded deer cull in the City. He urged Council to form a wildlife committee.

8. Doug Selby - Services Agreement with Recycle Ann Arbor (DC-2)

Doug Selby, 711 Fountain, spoke in support of DC-2, the Services Agreement with Recycle Ann Arbor for Interim Operation of the Material Recovery Facility. He also urged the City to make the MRF operational again long-term.

9. Laura Sanders - Immigration Solicitation (C-1)

Laura Sanders, representing the Washtenaw Inter-faith Coalition for Immigrant Rights, spoke about C-1, the ordinance regarding Immigration Solicitation. She requested Council remove the exception in the proposed language that allows law enforcement to question arrestees on their immigration status.
