#### 1. Jessica Prozinski - Sanctuary City (DC-1)

Jessica Prozinski spoke about the recent ICE action in the City and the efforts by local residents to stop the deportation of a local man. She urged the community to continue to fight against deportations. She asked local places of worship to come forward as sanctuaries for those at risk.

#### 2. Alexandria Schulz - Sanctuary City (DC-1)

Alexandria Schulz, Ypsilanti resident, urged Council to make Ann Arbor a true sanctuary city.

#### 3. Michael Psarouthakis - Morehead-Delaware Bridge (CA-18)

Michael Psarouthakis spoke in support of CA-18, funding for the proposed Morehead-Delaware Bridge.

#### 4. Debbie Merion - Morehead-Delaware Bridge (CA-18)

Debbie Merion spoke in support of the proposed funding for the Morehead-Delaware Bridge.

#### 5. Christopher Swinko - Backyard Chicken Ordinance (C-2)

Christopher Swinko, a teacher at Summer's Knoll School, along with his fourth grade students, spoke in support of C-2, the Ordinance Amendment regarding Chapter 107, regarding Backyard Chickens.

A public hearing was conducted on the proposed Resolution to Adopt Ann Arbor City Budget and Related Property Tax Millage Rates for Fiscal Year 2018. Notice of public hearing was published April 20, 2017.

The following persons were present to speak at the hearing:

Kai Petainen, resident, spoke about the LDFA and pedestrian crossings. An unknown resident spoke about the deer cull and urged continued funding for the non-lethal surgical sterilization program. She also stated she collected the \$12,000 she pledged last fall to offset the additional cost of this method.

Sabra Sanzotta, member of A2Non-Lethal Deer Management, presented the City with a check for \$12,125.00 for the difference in cost to implement non-lethal deer management methods.

Susan Hutton, Chair of the City's Environmental Commission, spoke in support of funding for Climate Action Plan.

Nancy Ogilvie, co-founder of Elders Climate Action locally, spoke in support of funding for Climate Action Plan.

Lisa Abrams of FAAWN spoke in support of non-lethal methods of deer management and she urged Council to stop funding a deer cull.

Nirmala Hahnke, Ward 3, spoke in opposition to additional funding for a deer cull. She urged Council to place a one-year moratorium on the deer cull.

Grant Shafer, Pittsfield Township resident, spoke in opposition to funding for a deer cull. He also stated the City's \$100 fee for a FOIA request he submitted is too high. Jim Mogensen spoke in support of funding for Human Services and urged Council to do more for vulnerable residents.

Paula Cattel spoke about safety in Ann Arbor for children, stating St. Paul's Lutheran School and Greenhills High School do not have any signs or markings alerting motorists of crossing children.

Brigit Macomber, First Ward, spoke on behalf of the Ecology Center, and urged Council to fund Climate Action Plan activities to address climate change.

Kathy Griswold, 2nd Ward, stated another pedestrian was killed on October 24. She urged the Council to fund pedestrian crossings and lighting of the City's crosswalks.
