

- Local Government Run
 - Elected officials
 - 171 members

- Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO)
 - Regional Transportation Plan
 - Transportation Improvement Program
 - Air Quality Conformity
 - Population and Economic Forecast
 - Transportation Model

Washtenaw Area Transportation Study (WATS)

- Planning focused on Washtenaw County
- Federal Aid Committee
 - Proposes and prioritizes projects for Washtenaw County

Ann Arbor and (SE Michigan) *Demographics*

- Population: 122,000 (4.7 million)
 Daytime: 177,000 (5.1 million)
- Formal Education
 - Bachelor's or more 71% (28%)
- Jobs: 121,000 (2.5 million)
- Central place (multiple centers)



Ann Arbor and (SE Michigan) Transportation

- Miles of public road: 339 (25,053)
- Transportation to work
 - Drove alone 58% (84%)
 - Transit 9% (2%)
 - Walking 15% (2%)
- Crashes (2016)
 - Fatal 3 (400)
 - Serious Injury 28 (1,692)

- Identifies large projects and spending priorities (federal-aid system)
- Performance measures

Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)


- Four years
- List of highway and transit projects that use federal aid
- Consistent with RTP
- General Program Accounts
 - Groupings of "sub-projects"



Basic Transportation Funding



Washtenaw County: ~\$6 million/year

Expected Funding vs. Need



To reach a goal of 80% of roads to be "good" or "fair" a total of \$41 billion, or \$1.6 billion per year, will be needed over the next 25 years

Funding Programs

- Surface Transportation Program
 - Most of the formula funding
- Transportation Alternatives Program
 - Discretionary grants, state and regional
 - Ped and Bike, Streetscapes, Green Infra
- Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality
 - Signal timing, roundabouts, operations
- TIGER/INFRA
 - Federal discretionary grants
