#### 4. Glenn Nelson - Revenue from the Mental Health Services and Public Safety Millage

Glenn Nelson, 1323 S. Forest Ave., spoke about the City's proposed use of the refund that will be given to the City from the County Mental Health and Public Safety Millage. He urged Council to use the money to support mental health services and improve service in this area, not on other Council priorities.

#### CC COMMUNICATIONS FROM COUNCIL

#### COUNCILMEMBER LUMM

Councilmember Lumm spoke about her Agenda Questions and stated several questions were not answered. She stated she would like a follow-up regarding the AAPD contract language regarding vehicle replacement and whether the provision could be easily renegotiated.

She also asked for a follow-up regarding Toll Brothers and whether the development agreement addressed any cost sharing for infrastructure improvements, including the Nixon corridor.

Councilmember Lumm also addressed the City Administrator's report and several City grant applications, particularly for sidewalk improvements on Fuller Road near Huron High School. She asked for more information on this project, especially if there are any plans to move the crosswalk location.

#### COUNCILMEMBER ACKERMAN

Councilmember Ackerman stated a community meeting would be held on Thursday, March 22 from 5-7pm at the Senior Center to discuss the upcoming DTE substation projects. DTE will be available to discuss all aspects of the project, including impacts to neighbors.

#### COUNCILMEMBER SMITH

Councilmember Smith spoke about the Environmental Commission Work Session held on February 22, regarding the Solid Waste Fund fund balance and the 5-year Solid Waste plan. Councilmember Smith stated the Commission is expecting an update from the consultant regarding the future of the MRF.

#### COUNCILMEMBER GRAND

Councilmember Grand thanked Mayor Taylor and Superintendent Jeanice Swift for their advocacy and urged the public to continue to support the AAPS and their students on the upcoming scheduled walk-out in support of gun regulations.

Councilmember Grand also reported that the Greenbelt Commission is seeking two new members, a real estate professional and a biologist. Councilmember Grand urged residents who meet these qualifications to apply.
