# **City Council**

#### CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Taylor called the Special Session of the Ann Arbor City Council to order at 5:00 p.m. in the Guy C. Larcom, Jr. Building, 2nd Floor Council Chambers, 301 E. Huron Street.

#### READING OF ORDER AND NOTICE OF CALL OF SPECIAL SESSION

City Clerk Jacqueline Beaudry read the notice and order of Special Session:

Notice is hereby given that a special session of the City of Ann Arbor City Council will be held on Tuesday, May 1, 2018 at 5:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers, 2nd floor of the Guy C. Larcom Jr. City Hall Building, 301 E. Huron St., for the following purpose:

• Closed Session under the Michigan Open Meetings Act for pending litigation and written attorney client privileged communication set forth or incorporated in MCLA 15.268 (e) and (h).

Open Session:

• Resolution to Amend the Budget and Appropriate Fund not to exceed \$4,200,000.00 from the General Fund Balance to Effect the City's Ownership of 350 South Fifth Avenue (\$4,200,000.00) (8 Votes Required) (Postponed from the 4/2/18, 4/16/18 and 4/23/18 regular and special sessions of Council.)

PUBLIC COMMENT - GENERAL (3 MINUTES EACH)

Sam Copi, 818 Henry, asked that Council provide more clarity regarding income and rent requirements when discussing the Y Lot.

Sharon Ongaro, 506 Pauline Blvd., expressed the need for more affordable housing in Ann Arbor and urged Council to develop affordable housing on the Y Lot.

Patti Smith, Ward 3 resident, spoke in support of affordable housing in Ann Arbor and asked that Council vote for work force and affordable housing and buy back the Y Lot.

Margaret Cruize, Ann Arbor resident, said that Ann Arbor has no emergency shelter and to bring back affordable housing on the Y Lot.

Hawthorne Stabler, resident of Oakland County, spoke about the need for more affordable housing in Ann Arbor, stating she can't afford to live here.

Amory Jhou, resident, spoke in support of affordable housing and urged Council to buy back the Y Lot.

(Councilmembers Kailasapathy and Warpehoski arrived at 5:14 p.m.)

Danielle Hoover, social worker in Washtenaw County, spoke in support of affordable housing and urged Council to buy back the Y Lot.

Jordan Adams, Ann Arbor resident, spoke in support of affordable housing.

Sandi Smith, 1st Ward resident and former Councilmember, spoke about the rising cost of housing in Ann Arbor and urged Council to take action to make housing more affordable for the work force.

A Ward 2 resident spoke in support of affordable housing.

A Northside resident spoke in support of affordable housing.

Sakinah Rahman, Young Citizen of the Year, and her twin sister, spoke on behalf of Ozone House and Youth House of Washtenaw County, and addressed Council regarding affordable housing.

Ricky Jefferson, Washtenaw County District 6 of Ypsilanti Township, said that people from his district are concerned about affordable housing in the area and urged Ann Arbor to support affordable housing for the entire region.

Ramon Williams, representing Ozone House, said that it is going to take more than the purchase of the Y Lot to help with affordable housing, but urged Council to make this first step.

Karen Lovejoy Roe, Ypsilanti Township Clerk, spoke about affordable housing and the need for transportation networks in the entire community, stating working people need to be able to get to the job centers.

A resident of Ypsilanti spoke in support of the buyback of the Y Lot.

Wendy Carty-Saxon, Real Estate Director of Avalon Housing, said that the biggest challenge is finding land and gaining site control for affordable housing. Ms. Carty-Saxon said that she was in support of purchasing the Y Lot.

Jing Stiller, Ypsilanti resident, spoke in support of affordable housing.

Thaddeus Jabzanka, Ann Arbor resident and HHSAB chair, said that there is no reason to vote no on the purchase of the Y Lot and this should not be a political decision.

Andrew Stumpff, 618 S. Ashley, said that it would be irresponsible for City Council to vote no on the purchase of the Y Lot.

Phil Bianco, Ward 4 resident, spoke in favor of repurchasing the Y Lot with rental caps. He stated 150% of AMI is too high.

Greg Pratt, Ward 3 resident and a HHSAB board member, thanked Council for meeting to discuss the purchase of the Y Lot and spoke in support of the proposed Resolution of Intent.

Jaime Magiera, Ward 4 resident, spoke about transportation issues and environmental concerns.

An unidentified Ypsilanti City resident urged Council to be a leader in affordable housing for the region.

Stephanie Mercier, Ward 4 resident, encouraged Council to support affordable housing and to buy back the Y Lot.

Bo Kepp, a Huron High School student, said the purchase of the Y Lot is an opportunity for Council to improve the way a lot of people live in Ann Arbor.
