If it were not for Kharum, I'm sure I would have moved long ago. However, his generosity, mental health professionalism, and capabilities; have and still do make my home at Miller Manor a safe haven, and as I call it, "my nest" to live in.

Even if Mr. Sheikh only was a resident at Miller Manor, he exemplifies one of the most considerate, and giving person this home of mine has seen.

His sincerity is genuine and he extends it toward every resident of our community.

I have had the pleasure to work with Kharum on many projects for the benefit of all residents at Miller Manor.

I will mention below, only some of the wonderful things we have done together:

- 1.) He made it possible for me to obtain funding to beautify the landscape (grounds) of Miller Manor. After only one year of his support, the H.U.D. Scores for the outside environment "sky-rocketed". Nearly, every resident took pride in our beautiful setting.
- 2) He has spent hundreds of dollars on all of us at Miller Manor to enhance our standards of living. He purchased a big screen T.V. when they were very expensive. Also, he pays for a number of parties in which he donates refreshments and cash prizes. And considerately, he does this consistently. No one else has done this.
- 3) As a resident of Miller Manor, he opted to be concerned for our well-being and extended this by being a respectable advocate of our numerous needs - especially those of psychological nature.

I, myself, am very educated, but do not flaunt this aspect of myself. And, Khurum is the same way, if not more so. Instead, we utilize our

very reclusive,

B) Assist numerous residents to
create garden plots and/or choose
plants,

C) Become an activist for the
wellbeing of those of us with
mental health issues,

D) To hold barbecues and
other, social events,

E) Recover from my having
to leave medical school because
of numerous disabilities. And,
helped me get my \$225,000.00 worth
of medical student loans "discharged."

5) Together, Khurum and I have had
the chance to get an acting troupe to
practice at Miller Manor.

... And, in return the residents receive a stipend from these actors. Plus, Khurum pays for the transportation, tickets, and refreshments for all residents who want to attend the theatrical plays this group succeeds in.

- 6) More recently, Detective Sheikh has become interested in the comedy circuit and he always invites everyone. Again, he pays for tickets, refreshments, and transportation. Many enjoy this luxury.
- 7) At one time Khurum could not be part of the Miller Manor Resident Council, but now he plays an active role, and one of experienced leadership. If it weren't for Mr. Sheikh, I think our community would have taken a serious 'blow' to our lives and community.
- 8) His teaching / leadership skills have enhanced - more than anyone else I've met - the education of everyone around him. Whether it be teaching classes at EMU, the city's citizens' community group, or the weekly Crime Meetings at Miller Manor; he relentlessly gives his time and more importantly, his sincere regard to all residents of Miller Manor.
